WHEN DO I VOTE?

Voting takes place from 8am on February 21 to 8pm on February 28.

HOW DO I VOTE?

Voting takes place electronically. Log into GoWMU, then click apps. To the right of Elearning is ExperienceWMU (it's yellow). Once you click on it, you will be taken directly to the poll, where you will be able to vote.

The SAF Increase

What is the Student Assessment Fee (SAF)?

The SAF is a \$42 fee paid by all students, every semester, which goes to support Registered Student Organizations (RSOs),
Leadership Development, and the Campus Community.
The fee directly supports students with events like CAB
Concerts, Mental Health Week, RSO Events and more!

What is Wrong With the Current Level?

Due to exponentially increasing student engagement on campus, we are allocating more than we are bringing in

What Would it be Raised to?

A raise of just \$20 would bring the SAF to \$62 a semester, which would sustain student engaement for the next 5-10 years, allowing broncos of this generation and next to reach their full potential

Why Should I Vote Yes?

Even if you aren't a part of every club, it goes towards amazing clubs and events led by students just like you! The State of Michigan sets maximums on the yearly raise in tution, so a raise in the SAF decreases the total amount that tuition can be raised by.
